Dear Ms. DeNovio:

On behalf of the King County's Utilities Technical Review Committee (UTRC), I am writing to you in your capacity as the Executive Director of the East King County Regional Water Association (RWA) and your attendant duties related to the East King County Coordinated Water System Plan October 1989 (CWSP). A timely and reasonable service appeal has been filed pursuant to the CWSP. The CWSP provides a process to review and determine whether or not an existing purveyor can provide service in a timely and reasonable manner. The CWSP confers upon the RWA a responsibility to determine whether or not an offer of service on a Certificate of Water availability is timely and reasonable. If the RWA is unable to make a determination, then review by the UTRC is appropriate. This letter is intended to notify the RWA of the appeal and to request you use existing procedures to make this determination. Please let me know at your earliest convenience should the RWA choose to not address this appeal.

The Sallal Water Association (Sallal) issued a certificate of water availability to Cedar River Holdings for a development within its service area. Cedar River Holdings filed a timely and reasonable appeal with the King County UTRC with regard to the time, terms, and conditions for service on the certificate of water availability. Enclosed is the record in this matter including:


- Notice and Statement of Appeal by Cedar River Holdings;

- Statement of Defense from Sallal;

- Filing by Friends of the Snoqualmie Trail and River (an interested party), and
- Additional information from Cedar River Holdings, the City of North Bend and Friends of the Snoqualmie Trail and River.
